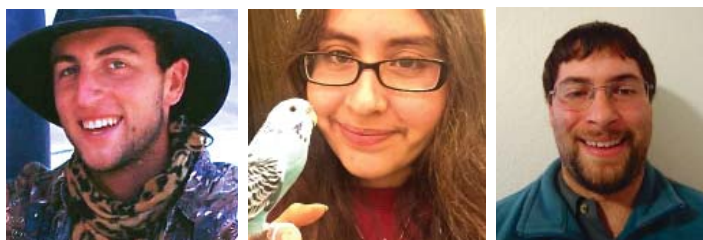
A local family has stepped forward with a very generous offer to MATCH ALL FUNDS THAT WE CAN RAISE THROUGH MARCH 31, 2019

NEW MONARCH BUTTERFLY PROJECT IN BAYSIDE

When was the last time you saw a Monarch butterfly in Bayside?

Bayside Pride, Inc. and the Jacoby Creek Land Trust recently partnered to focus on the plight of the iconic Monarch butterfly. The Bayside Monarch Project was first inspired by Bayside resident, Richard Beresford, who several years ago, began a backyard project, growing milkweed to attract monarch butterflies and provide a haven for their eggs. The two Bayside organizations joined forces for the project's two main goals: (1) To learn what we can do and to take action in our Jacoby Creek Valley to save monarchs from extinction; and (2) to mobilize the community --bringing together Bayside residents, organizations, and schools for planting work parties, speaker series, Monarch art exhibits, movie nights, and the necessary measurement and monitoring of "citizen science." The two organizations have been awarded a startup mini-grant to cover basic expenses of seeds, plants, and supplies; and are pursuing additional grant support.

The Bayside Monarch Project is fortunate to have experienced Bayside gardeners like Richard Beresford and Sue Moore, the lead gardener at the Jacoby Creek School Garden. Moreover, the Project is able to draw science and expertise from Humboldt State University faculty and students, local offices of federal and state agencies, California Native Plant Society-Redwood Chapter, Humboldt Botanical Gardens, Sequoia Zoo, and resources from throughout the Redwood Coast.

Just launched this month, local and national resources are being compiled by HSU student, Kayla Garcia, for her senior capstone project.
